



Stine Marit Moen

Stine Marit Moen, MD, PhD, is senior consultant in neurology and head of research and development at the MS-Centre Hakadal Norway.

She holds a medical doctor degree from the University of Oslo in 1997. She has worked within neurology at the Department of Neurology, Innlandet Hospital Lillehammer and over ten years at the Department of Neurology at Oslo University Hospital, focusing on diagnosis, treatment and follow-up of MS. She obtained her PhD degree with the thesis "Multiple sclerosis, bone health, and vitamin D" in 2012 and held a position from 2015 as associate professor in neurology at the Institute of Clinical Medicine, University of Oslo.

The fall of 2016 she entered a new position as a chief medical officer at the MS Centre Hakadal, a key national MS rehabilitation centre located just outside Oslo. The MS-Centre Hakadal is member of the RIMS (Rehabilitation in MS, European Network for best practice and research) and member of the Norwegian Brain Council.

Dr. Moen is a member of the Norwegian MS Competence Centre's Reference Group and a member of the Norwegian MS Society Advisory Board. She is also an associated member of the MS Research Group at Oslo University Hospital and the University of Oslo headed by prof. Hanne Flinstad Harbo and deputy group leader prof. Elisabeth Gulowsen Celius. Dr. Moen was the first author in the 2016 published initiative for national recommendations on the use of MRI in MS in Norway. She has authored more than 15 international peer-review papers.

In addition to bedside clinical neurology Dr. Moen has special interest in MS epidemiology, clinical studies, symptomatic treatment and rehabilitation.
